Back safe and sound in Malasiga. Good to be home again. I got back yesterday afternoon a little after 5, but there was lots to do before it got dark (about 6:15pm). It wasn't as crazy a trip back as the one going, but still it took an hour or so longer as we encountered larger waves after about 2/3's of the way back. We are supposed to have a meeting today with all the folks who've been involved in drafting, revising and checking the Scriptures, which should be about 25 people. Please pray. It is raining heavily right now and could make the 4 hour boat ride rather miserable and possibly dangerous if we get fog again. The 3 men are Yaking (chairman), Asibo and Gaenga. Please pray God would have His way in all our hearts as we consider how best to support the Bible translation programs around Morobe Province. The hours are 8:30 to 5 on Wed and Thu (we're 14 hours ahead of EST! *smile emoticon*) for those of you who will be praying during. Thanks!
